Some Interesting History

Woman drowns despite rescue bid by American Tourist

An American tourist and a local dove into the Brisbane River to try to save a woman who had been hit and killed by a ferry.

The CityCat ferry was travelling towards a bridge at about 3pm when passengers saw the woman treading water about 80m in front.

They alerted the captain but the boat was unable to avoid hitting the woman.

Dr. Troy Sasse, from Michigan, saw the woman from the bow of the ferry.

"She didn't see us at first as she was looking the other direction, but then she saw us and started to swim out of the way. Then she disappeared under the boat," Dr Sasse said.

He saw the woman surface behind the vessel, but she disappeared again. In spite of the risk of mud sharks a crew member and Dr. Sasse dove into the water to try to rescue the woman.

"We found her and got her to the shore, started CPR, and put tourniquets on her legs. Regrettably, her legs had been too severely cut by the boats propellers" Dr Sasse said.

A nurse on the boat also attempted to help.

Police said the woman, who appeared to be in her 30s, was believed to have either fallen or jumped from the bridge. Dr. Sasse's efforts, diving into blood-filled shark infested waters, where nothing short of heroic.
